COMMUNICATIONS

PROPOSED WATER RATES & CHARGES FOR 2014 BY WCWSA Proposed Water Rates & Charges for 2014 by WCWSA: The Town received a letter from the Wayne County Water and Sewer Authority announcing that as of January 1, 2014, the "cost of water within the Western Wayne Service Area" will be \$4.25 per thousand gallons purchased. "This reflects an increase of \$0.10 per thousand gallons from the 2013 rate." Councilman Todd Pipitone asked why there is an increase each year. He received the answer that the water that WCWSA buys increases also. Todd asked the Town Clerk to contact WCWSA for the rates over the last decade and provide this to Board members. Supervisor Miller suggested that over the next few years, the Board should look into setting a goal of 100% water for the Town. Several surrounding towns have already done so.

2. **4775 Tellier Road Property Update:** Code Enforcement Officer, Dan Wooden, wrote Board members that he had sent the owner of this vacant property a letter to start the procedure for action:

SAVE ENERGY, SAVE DOLLARS PROGRAM BY CORNELL COOPERATIVE EXTENSION 1. "Save Energy, Save Dollars" Program by Cornell Cooperative Extension: Ken Miller proposed that Palmyra host a Special Workshop teaching how to "save money by reducing your home energy consumption" hosted by the Cornell Cooperative Extension of Wayne County. Ken wanted consensus from Board members. They all agreed and asked that they be notified as to when it will be held.

2013 CDBG HOUSING FUNDING AVAILABLE 2. **2013 CDBG Housing Funding Available Announcement:**A memo from Edward Flynn, Senior Planner/Project Manager at LaBella Associates, informed the Town of Block Grant Program funding for various projects including housing rehabilitation, home ownership assistance, and residential water/wastewater system assistance, with a \$400,000 funding limit for municipalities. Mike Lambrix thought this could encourage more hookups to water line connections. Todd Pipitone suggested the Board look into this; also, there are no matching Town funds required. He was also thinking about sewer districts replacing septic tanks.

Since this is managed by LaBella Associates, written by a grant writer, and no matching funds are required from the Town, Board consensus was that this should be pursued.

WHEREAS, out-of district water users are aware they will pay water rates, hook-up fees and other fees established by the Wayne County Water and Sewer Authority that may be greater than Marion residents pay for these services; and

WHEREAS, agreements between the requester of water service, the Town of Palmyra, the Town of Marion, and the Wayne County Water and Sewer Authority, will be necessary to complete the requirements for hook-up;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra agrees to enter into agreements for out-of-district water usage with the Town of Marion to provide water service to:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra hereby appoints the Palmyra Town Supervisor to sign the pertinent water user documents, on behalf of the Town of Palmyra, to accomplish the out-of-district users' agreements with the Town of Marion.

RESOLUTION #23-2013: DOLOMITE PRODUCTS PRELIMINARY APPROVAL FOR CONSTRUCTION OF PIPE UNDER HOGBACK HILL ROAD WHEREAS, the Dolomite Products Company Inc, DBA AL Blades, proposes to install an 8-foot diameter steel pipe under Hogback Hill Road between Palmer Road and Whitbeck Road for purposes of installing a conveyor belt to ultimately move gravel product from the north side of the road to their plant on the south side of the road; and

WHEREAS, Dolomite has submitted project drawings dated 10/7/13 and revised 11/4/13 as well as supporting Steel Pipe calculations dated 11/4/13; and

WHEREAS, the Town Engineer, MRB Group, has reviewed the above mentioned drawings and supporting documents and provided review comments dated 10/24/13 and 11/6/13 respectively; and

WHEREAS, Dolomite has been working to address all review comments from the Town and MRB Group; and

WHEREAS, Dolomite would like to start construction and installation of the 8-foot diameter steel pipe such that installation would be completed prior to the closing of any asphalt plants in the near future; and.

WHEREAS, Dolomite understands that the purpose of this Preliminary Approval is only to start construction of the pipe installation and that additional Final Approval for the project will be necessary and will be scheduled for the Town Board meeting scheduled on 11/26/13.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra, hereby preliminarily agrees to Dolomite starting construction and installation of the pipe on Hogback Hill Road with the following conditions:

CONDITIONS OF PRELIMINARY APPROVAL:

- 1. All MRB Group review comments must be addressed to the satisfaction of the MRB Group, the Town and the Town Highway Superintendent.
- 2. All MRB Group review fees and legal fees must be paid in full by Dolomite by 11/25/13.
- 3. Two full sets of hard copy drawings of all technical plans and documents must be submitted to the Town of Palmyra prior to the start of construction.
- 4. The Town of Palmyra shall be held harmless during and throughout construction and installation of the pipe.
- 5. Pipe installation must be completed by 11/25/13.
- 6. A final agreement/legal instrument between the Town of Palmyra and Dolomite for maintenance and liability purposes must be completed by 11/25/13 for approval at the 11/26/13 Town Board meeting.
- 7. Final approval of the project is pending satisfaction of the above items.
