Also attending was: Attorney Paul Rubery, Book Keeper Petra Anderson, and Highway Superintendent Mike Boesel.

TOPICS OF WORKSHOP

 Financing options for truck barn project: Book keeper Petra Anderson provided those in attendance with detailed reports showing the towns 2016 fund balances & budgeted appropriations, and stated that they would be discussing the General, DA Highway,

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DB Highway and Part Town Funds only. It was stated by the Town Supervisor that the town finances are in "good shape" at this time. Ms. Anderson also shared the information and financing options she had learned about while meeting with members of the NYS Comptrollers office earlier. It was recommended (as a guideline only) by the Comptrollers that a calculation of 15% of operating expenditures could be used as a reasonable amount of fund balance to be used. She did point out that this balance would be a very low amount that the board is not used to working with. Discussion ensued regarding the different options that were available to finance for the project. Finally, after explaining the different reserve funds, Ms. Anderson reminded the board that they will need to pay closer attention to the different reserves looked at during the budget process over the next few years.

 <u>Budget for truck barn project:</u> Mr. Rubery provided a beginning draft only of the resolutions needed to proceed with the project. After much discussion, it was decided that a turn-key budget proposal from Bluescope, along with engineers plan, was necessary to move forward, get bids, or to make any further decisions about financing.

<u>Motion to Adjourn:</u> At 7:13 PM, Todd Pipitone made the motion to adjourn the meeting.
