At the annual town meeting of the inhabitants of the Town of Palmyra held at the town house in the Village of Palmyra on Tuesday the 3d of April I838.

Then being but two Commissioners of Highways chosen, two others voted for as Commissioners, having received the greatest & an equal number of votes, it was voted that the meeting adjourn until tomorrow at two oclock p.m. to meet at the same place for the purpose of choosing a commissioner.

Wednesday, April 4, 2 oclock P.M.

The meeting convened pursuant to adjournment and proceeded to vote for a commissioner of highways. On counting the votes it was found that Ambrose Salsbury had received the greatest number of votes for that office

He was declared duly elected thereto -

**Voted –** That this meeting stand adjourned until the first Tuesday of April next then to be held at the School house near Hiram Fosters at 10 oclock A. M.
