The regular meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra, held on Thursday, January 14, 1960, at 3:00 p.m., at the town clerk's office was called to order by Supervisor Mate.

Mr. Pierce moved that W. Kay Converse be appointed Town Attorney for the Town of Palmyra for the year 1960. Seconded by Mr. Pierce Ayes 4, noes 0. Carried.

WHEREAS, on December 9th, 1959, the Wayne County Civil Service Commission held a Public Hearing on the proposed amendment to the rules which would make many appointed position in Town Government come under the non-competitive class of Civil Service.

WHEREAS, such changes in classification would materially increase the cost of town government by reason of larger salaries and increase costs of retirement contribution with no benefit to the Town.

IT IS RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra strongly and unanimously opposes the adoption of the amended rules by the Wayne County Civil Service Commission and urges that they be rejected.

FURTHER RESOLVE, that a certified copy of this resolution be sent to the Wayne County Civil Service Commission.

As the resolution regarding the establishment of the Canandaigua Road Water District Extension was not approved as to the method of financing,

The following resolution was offered by Mr. Nesbitt, who moved its adoption and seconded by Mr. Pierce:

RESOLUTION
AMENDING THE
METHOD OF
FINANCING
EXTENSION

WHEREAS, a resolution was heretofore and on the tenth day of Dec. 1959 duly adopted by the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra approving the establishment of an extension of the Canandaigua Road Water District as proposed in a petition theretofore presented to it, and

WHEREAS, such resolution provided that the proposed improvement including construction costs, engineers and legal fees and all other expenses should be financed as therein provided, and

WHEREAS, it is desired to amend the terms of repayment of the bonds which it is proposed shall be issued,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the said resolution heretofore adopted on the 10th day of December 1959, be amended by striking out that paragraph dealing with the method of financing the proposed improvement and inserting therein in place thereof the following:

"AND IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED: that the proposed improvement including construction costs, engineers and legal fees and all other expenses shall be financed as follows:

"By the issuance of the bonds of the said proposed extension payable over a period of twenty years with interest payable semi-annually; \$600.00 of principal to be retired each year for the first five years; \$700.00 of principal for the next five years and \$900.00 of principal to be retired each year for the next ten years or for as many years, not more than 10, as shall be required to pay the entire principal".

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk of this Town shall within ten days after the adoption of the amendment file certified copies of the original resolution and of this amendment thereto in duplicate in the Office of the State Department of Audit and Control at Albany, N. Y. together with an application by this Board in duplicate for permission to create such extension of said District as provided for by the Town Law, Sec. 194, and that such application shall be executed by and on behalf of the Town Board by the Supervisor of the Town

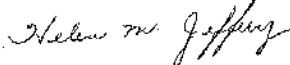

The following resolution was offered by Mr. Nesbitt who moved its adoption and seconded by Mr. Baran:

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra has become concerned over the increasing number of trailers and trailer camps, now usually designated as mobile homes and mobile home parks, within the limits of the town, without supervision as to sanitary arrangements and utility connections and often so situated to disregard the enjoyment of their property by adjoining owners, and

WHEREAS, in order to promote the health, safety, welfare and happiness of the residents of the Town, and to permit the full enjoyment of their premises by all of the residents in the Township, the said Town Board proposes to enact an ordinance regulating mobile homes and mobile home parks, which proposed ordinance has been submitted to the Board, read by the members and considered and approved,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk give notice of a public hearing on the question of the enactment of such ordinance by the publication of such notice in the official newspaper, The Palmyra Courier Journal, that such hearing be held on the 22nd day of March 1960, in the auditorium of the Canandaigua Street School Building at 8:00 o'clock in the evening of said day.

Be it further resolved that such proposed ordinance be published in full once at least ten days prior to the day specified for such hearing.

WHEREAS, a written petition dated February 22, 1960 in due form and containing the required signatures has been presented to and filed with the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra, Wayne County, New York, for the establishment of an extension of the Maple Avenue Water District in said Town to be bounded and described as follows:

ALL THAT TRACT OR PARCEL OF LAND situate in Town Lot Nor 77, Township 12, Range 2, Town of Palmyra, County of Wayne and State of New York, bounded and described as follows: Beginning at a point on the southerly line of Lot No. 2, Section 1, Fairlawn Subdivision, said line being the northerly line of land now or formerly owned by William C. Euell as recorded in Liber 425 of Deeds at page 512 at the intersection of said property line with the eastern boundary of Maple Avenue Water District, said Water District boundary line being 500 feet distant from the parallel to the centerline of Maple Avenue Extension; thence N 8°50' W along the eastern boundary of Maple Avenue Water District 500 feet distant from and parallel to the centerline of Maple Avenue Extension 1309.39 feet to a point thence N 7°55' W along the eastern boundary of Maple Avenue Water District 500 feet distant from and parallel to the centerline of Maple Avenue Extension 246.96 feet to a point on the northerly line of Lot No. 23; thence N 69° 47' E along the northerly line of Lot No. 23 86.78 feet to a point; thence S 53°50' E along Lots 23 and 24, 139.47 feet to a point; thence S 43°47' W along Lot No. 24 240.05 feet to a point in the north-easterly line of Meadow Drive S46°43' E 126.46 feet to a point, on a curve to the right having a delta angle of 37°49' a radius of 200.00 feet, 198.01 feet to a point, S8°54' E 523.47 feet to a point and on a curve to the right having a delta angle of 52°13' 30" a radius of 280.55 feet, 260.59 feet to a point; thence S 45°40' 40" E along the northeasterly line of Lot No. 3 480.32 feet to a point; thence N 83° 03' W along the southerly line of Lots 3 and 2 327.64 feet to the point of beginning. Reference is made to "Plan of Section 1 Fairlawn Subdivision.." made by Harnish & Lockup dated September 11, 1959.

And Whereas the improvements proposed consist of an extension of the Maple Avenue Water District in the territory above described; the supply of water to be purchased from the Village of Palmyra and to be furnished from and connected to the existing main at a point on the southerly line of Lot no. 2 Section 1, Fairlawn

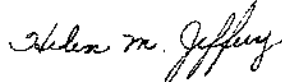

WHEREAS, a petition for the establishment of an extension of the Maple Avenue Water District in the Town of Palmyra, Wayne County, New York, dated February 22, 1960 was duly presented to the Town Board together with the necessary map and plan attached thereto, and

WHEREAS, an order was duly adopted by the said Town Board on the 22nd day of February 1960, reciting the filing of said petition, the improvements proposed, the boundaries of the proposed extension of such district and,

WHEREAS, the petitioners are the owners of all the premises embraced within such extension of such district and propose that water mains be laid at the expense of such owners with no expense to the proposed district, and

WHEREAS, such order specified March 17, 1960 at 7:30 P.M. as the time and the Justice Court Room in the Village Hall in the Village of Palmyra, New York, as the place where the said Board would meet to consider the petition and to hear all persons interested in the subject thereof concerning the same, and

WHEREAS, a hearing in the matter was duly held by the Board on the seventeenth day of March 1960, commencing at 7:30 p.m. in the Justice Room in the Village Hall in the Village of Palmyra, New York and discussion upon the matter was had, and there was no opposition thereto,

NOW UPON the evidence given upon such hearing and on motion of Hart E. Pierce, Jr., Justice of the Peace, seconded by Andrew Baran, Councilman, it is

RESOLVED AND DETERMINED, that

(a) The petition aforesaid is signed and acknowledged as required by law and it duly complies with all the requirements of Section 191 of the Town Law as to sufficiency of signors with respect to the boundaries of the proposed district as herein approved and it is otherwise sufficient.

RESOLUTION APPROVING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF EXTENSION OF THE MAPLE AVENUE WATER DISTRICT

(b) All the property and property owners within the proposed district are benefited thereby.

(c) All the property and property owners benefited are included within the limits of the proposed district.

(d) It is in the public interest to grant in whole the relief sought and, it is further

RESOLVED AND DETERMINED that the establishment of an extension of the Maple Avenue Water District as proposed in said petition be approved; that the improvement therein mentioned be constructed upon the required funds being made available or provided for without expense to the extension of such district or to the Town, and that such district shall be designated and known as the Extension of Maple Avenue Water District of the Town of Palmyra, and shall be bounded and described as follows:

A Public Hearing was held by the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra on the 22nd day of March 1960, at 8:00 p.m., at the Canandaigua Street School Auditorium for the purpose of hearing all those for or against the proposed Ordinance for the Regulation of Mobile Homes and Mobile Home Parks in the Town of Palmyra.

Present: Sherwood W. Yate, Supervisor

Proof of publication presented and filed.

Meeting was opened by the Supervisor announcing that this was a Public Hearing, called for the purpose of considering the proposed ordinance regulating mobile homes and mobile home parks in the Town and that the Board desires to hear all persons desiring to be heard.

Mr. & Mrs. Wilson VanManeghan and Mrs. Marian Finnerghy were the only ones present at this meeting and opposing the ordinance.

After hearing those present, the Supervisor closed the hearing, and

Hart B. Pierce, jr. Justice of the Peace, moved the enactment of the following Ordinance designed to regulate "Trailers" or "Mobile Homes":

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra, becoming concerned over the increasing number of trailers and trailer camps, now usually designated "mobile homes" and Mobile Home Parks", without supervision as to sanitary arrangements and utility connections, and often so situated as to interfere with the enjoyment of their property by adjoining owners, in order to promote the health, safety, welfare and happiness of the residents of the Town, proposed an ordinance for the regulation of such mobile homes and mobile home parks, and

WHEREAS, notice of a public hearing was duly given as required by law, and such hearing was held on this date, and it appears to the Town Board that such ordinance is desirable,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED and ordained that there be and hereby is enacted the following:

ORDINANCE FOR THE REGULATION OF MOBILE HOMES AND MOBILE HOME PARKS
IN THE TOWN OF PALMYRA, WAYNE COUNTY, NEW YORK.

SECTION I - TITLE

This ordinance shall be known and cited as the Mobile Home Ordinance of the Town of Palmyra.

SECTION II - PURPOSE

It is the purpose of this ordinance to promote the health, safety, happiness, morals and general welfare of the Town of Palmyra by the proper regulation of Mobile Homes and Mobile Home Parks.

SECTION III - DEFINITIONS

(a) "Mobile Home". The term "Mobile Home" as used in this ordinance shall be defined as any vehicle or combination of vehicles used, designed for use, or capable of being used as sleeping or living quarters, either propelled by its own power or the power of another vehicle to which it may be attached. Any addition to such Mobile Home, shall, for the purpose of this ordinance be deemed to be a part of such Mobile Home.

(b) "Mobile Home Park". The term "Mobile Home Park" as used in this ordinance shall be defined as any lot, piece or parcel of ground whereon three or more Mobile Homes are located or parked otherwise than for the purpose of loading, unloading or discharge or entrance of occupants or passengers.

(c) "Park Unit". The term "Park Unit" as used in this ordinance shall be defined as a lot or space in any Mobile Home Park which shall be assigned to or used or occupied by any one Mobile Home.

SECTION IV - PERMIT REQUIRED FOR
MOBILE HOME PARKS

No person, firm or corporation being the owner, lessee or occupant of any land or premises within the Town of Palmyra shall use or permit the use of said land or premises as a Mobile Home Park without obtaining a permit therefor as hereinafter provided.

SECTION V - ISSUANCE OF PERMIT FOR
MOBILE HOME PARK.

(a) Application for permit. The application for each Mobile Home Park shall be in writing and signed by the applicant. It shall state:

1. The name and address of the applicant.
2. The name and address of each partner if the applicant be a partnership.
3. The name and address of each officer and director if the applicant be a corporation.
4. A complete description of the premises upon which the proposed park is to be located.
5. The name and address of the owner or owners of such premises.
6. The number of park units to be provided in the proposed park.

The application shall be in duplicate and accompanied by two sets of plans specifications drawn to scale, showing the layout of the park, the location, size and arrangement of each unit, location of street, location of water services, the proposed system of sewage disposal and the location of garbage receptacles, where the applicant is not the owner of the premises the application shall also be accompanied by a certified or photostatic copy of the lease of the premises.

(b) Filing of Application. Each application shall be filed with the Town Clerk who shall thereupon transmit one duplicate copy thereof to the Town Health Officer, who, shall, after investigation transmit the application to the Town Board together with his written approval or recommendations pertaining thereto. All such applications, shall, after investigation, be approved or rejected by the Town Board and the applicants notified in writing by the Town Clerk of the action taken thereon. If such application be rejected, the applicant shall have the right to appear before the Town Board for a hearing.

(c) Issuance of Permit. If such application is approved the Town Clerk shall issue a permit; such permit to become effective from the date thereof and to continue in force through the 31st day of December next succeeding for the use of the premises therein specified as a Mobile Home Park. Such permit shall specify the number of park units which may be used in said park. Such permit shall not be transferrable or assignable.

SECTION VI - REGULATIONS FOR MOBILE HOME PARKS.

(a) All lands used as a Mobile Home Park shall be properly graded to insure proper drainage during the following rainfall.

(b) Each Mobile Home Park shall be subdivided and marked off into park units. Each unit shall contain at least 2400 square feet and shall be at least 40 x 60 feet in dimension. No more than one mobile home shall be permitted to occupy any one park unit. The park units shall be grouped in blocks with streets at least 30 feet wide between each block. Each park unit shall have direct access to a park street. Mobile Homes shall be so placed on each park unit that there will be at least a distance of twenty (20) feet between mobile homes. No park unit shall be located within one hundred (100) feet of any public highway, nor within fifty (50) feet of any adjacent property line. Each mobile home park and all parts thereof shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition at all times.

(c) Water Connection. Each such mobile home park shall be provided with proper water connections to each such park unit.

(d) Each park unit shall contain a toilet, lavatory and a shower or bathtub.

(e) All sewage and other water carried waste shall be disposed into a private system, provided a municipal sewage system is unavailable. Such private system shall be inspected by the Health Officer of the Town and be approved by him prior to being placed in operation.

(f) Garbage Receptacles. Each mobile home park shall provide equipment sufficient to prevent littering of the grounds and premises with rubbish, garbage and refuse and provide fly-tight metal depositories with tight fitting covers at convenient locations upon such premises. Such depositories shall be kept at all times in a sanitary condition.

(g) Each mobile home park shall provide underground weather-proof electric service connections and outlets for each park unit. All such connections and outlets shall be of the type approved by the New York State Board of Fire Underwriters.

SECTION VII - RECORDS

The owner or operator of each mobile home park shall keep a permanent record in writing of all persons occupying or using the facilities of such mobile home park, which record shall include the name and address of each occupant, the dates of arrival and departure, the name and address of the owner of each mobile home, the make and color thereof and the registration number of each mobile home.

SECTION VIII - INSPECTION

Any Peace Officer and the Health Officer of the Town shall have the right at any reasonable time to enter any mobile home park and shall have the right at all times to inspect all parts of said premises and to inspect the records required to be kept in every Mobile Home Park.

SECTION IX - REVOCATION OF PERMIT

If a Police Officer or the Health Officer of the Town finds that any mobile home park is not being maintained in a clean and sanitary condition or is not being conducted in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance, such fact shall thereupon be reported to the Town Board, and the said Town Board may direct the Town Clerk to serve an order in writing upon the holder of the permit or the person in charge of said park, directing that the conditions therein specified be remedied within ten days after the day of service of such order. If such conditions are not corrected within said ten day period, the Town Board may cause a notice in writing to be served upon the holder of said permit or the person in charge of said Mobile Home Park requiring the holder of the permit to appear before the Town Board at a time to be specified in such notice and show cause why such Mobile Home Park permit should not be revoked. At such hearing the Town Board may take the testimony of the witnesses and the testimony of the holder of the permit or the person in charge of the park, if he appears, and if the Town Board shall find that the park is not being maintained in a clean and sanitary condition or if it finds that any of the provisions of this ordinance are being violated, or if it finds there is other sufficient cause, it may revoke the permit and the premises shall forthwith cease to be used as a Mobile Home Park and all mobile homes shall forthwith be removed therefrom.

SECTION X - RENEWAL OF PERMIT

Application for the renewal of any Mobile Home Park permit which has been issued pursuant to this ordinance must be filed with the Town Clerk on or before the first day of December next preceding the expiration of the permit. The application for such renewal shall be in writing and signed by the applicant and shall contain the same information as required by Section 7, Subdivision "a" of this ordinance in the case of the original application for a permit, except that such renewal application need not be accompanied by a plan of the Mobile Home Park nor by the lease of the premises unless a new lease has been entered into subsequent to the time of filing the previous application, in which event a certified or photostatic copy of the lease shall be attached to the application for renewal. Upon the approval of said application for renewal of the permit by the Health Officer and the Town Board, the Town Clerk shall issue a renewal permit which shall become effective on the expiration of the prior permit and continue in force for a term of one year. Such renewal permit shall not be transferred or assigned.

SECTION XI - APPLICATION TO EXISTING
MOBILE HOME PARKS

Existing mobile home parks located in the Town of Palmyra on the effective date of this ordinance shall be subject to all of the provisions of the sanitary code of the State of New York; shall keep the records required by Section 7 above; shall be subject to inspection as required by Section 8 above; and shall annually apply for a permit as provided in Section 5a above, except that in making such application, the applicant shall not be required to furnish plans and specifications showing the lay-out of the park; such application shall be processed as in Section 5b and c above.

Any additions, extensions or enlargements of the existing parks or of parks hereafter licensed, shall be made in compliance with all of the conditions of this ordinance. The owner or operator of any existing park shall have ninety (90) days after this ordinance becomes effective to make an application to operate such park.

SECTION XII - REGULATIONS FOR MOBILE
HOMES NOT LOCATED IN A MOBILE HOME
PARK

(a) No Mobile home shall be parked or allowed to remain upon any street or highway or any other public place for a longer period than four hours, except that emergency parking or stopping occasioned by mechanical failure is permitted upon the shoulder of any street or highway for a period not longer than 24 hours, subject however, to any other and further prohibitions, regulations or limitations imposed by law, parking regulations or ordinance.

(b) No Mobile Home shall be parked or placed within the Town outside of a duly licensed Mobile Home park except as follows:

1. Any owner or occupant of a Mobile Home may, upon payment of the fee hereafter set forth be granted a permit to park or place such mobile home on premises outside of a mobile home park. Such permit shall be valid for a term of three months and no additional permit shall be granted within a period of twelve months from the date of the original permit, except that the Town Board after an examination of the facts and after according the applicant an opportunity to be heard, may upon a finding of hardship or sufficient extenuating circumstances grant an extension of such permit for a period not to exceed an additional three months.

2. An owner of land located within the Town who intends to construct a dwelling house thereon for his own occupancy, after compliance with the provisions of this ordinance and the payment of the fee hereinafter set forth, may be granted a permit to park or place a mobile home on said land during the construction of said dwelling house, but not to exceed a period of one year. Such permit may be extended by the Town Board for an additional period of one year. No further extension shall be granted by the Town Board, except that after an examination of the facts and after according the applicant an opportunity to be heard, the Town Board may, upon a finding of hardship or extenuating circumstances grant a further extension of said permit for a period not to exceed one year.

SECTION XIII - ISSUANCE OF PERMIT FOR MOBILE
HOMES NOT LOCATED IN MOBILE HOME PARKS.

(a) Application for permit. The application for each Mobile Home permit shall be in writing signed by the applicant and shall state the name and address of the applicant, the name and address of each partner if the applicant be a partnership, the name and address of each officer and director if the applicant be a corporation. A complete description of the premises upon which the Mobile Home is to be located and the name and address of the owners of such premises.

The application shall be accompanied by a plan in duplicate, drawn to scale and showing the boundaries of the premises, the proposed location of the Mobile Home on the premises, the location and plan of the proposed water supply and sewage disposal system. If the applicant is not the owner in fee of the premises the application must be accompanied by a certified or photostatic copy of the written lease, or, if there be no written lease, by the written acknowledged consent of the owner of the premises.

(b) Filing of Application. Such application shall be filed in duplicate with the Town Clerk and shall be transmitted by such Clerk to the Health Officer who shall return the same to the Town Board with his written approval or recommendations pertaining thereto. The Town Board shall approve or reject such applications and the Town Clerk shall notify the applicant in writing of the action taken. If the application is rejected, the applicant shall have the right to appear before the Town Board for a hearing. If the application is approved, the Town Clerk, upon receipt of the fee hereinafter provided shall issue a permit as provided in Section 12 of this ordinance.

(c) Application for an extension of any permit granted pursuant to this section may be made by letter and may be accompanied only by such information as may be required by the Town Clerk or the Town Board.

(d) Fees. The applicant for such permit shall at the time of issuance of such permit or any extension thereof pay to the Town Clerk a fee of \$5.00

SECTION XIV - REGULATION OF MOBILE HOMES OUTSIDE MOBILE HOME PARKS

(a) Water supply and sewage disposal system. Any Mobile Home parked or placed outside a duly licensed Mobile Home Park shall have an adequate supply of pure drinking water and a sewage disposal system of a type approved by the Health Officer of the Town of Palmyra. No Mobile Home so parked or placed shall be occupied until the permit has been granted as above provided.

(b) Location and set back. No occupied Mobile home outside a duly licensed mobile home park shall be parked or placed within 50 feet of any public highway nor within 50 feet of any adjacent property line.

SECTION XV - REVOCATION OF PERMIT

If a Police Officer or Health Officer finds that any mobile home outside a mobile home park is not being maintained in a clean or sanitary condition or is not being maintained in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance, such facts shall thereupon be reported to the Town Board and the Town Board may direct the Town Clerk to serve an order in writing upon the holder of the permit and/or the owner of the mobile home, and/or the owner of the premises, directing that the condition therein specified be remedied within ten days after the date of the service of the order. If such conditions are not corrected after the expiration of such ten day period, the Town Board may cause a notice in writing to be served upon the holder of such permit and/or the owner of said mobile home and/or the owner of the premises upon which it is located, requiring the person so served to appear before the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra at a time to be specified in such notice and show cause why such mobile home permit should not be revoked. At such hearing the Town Board may take the testimony of witnesses and the testimony of the holder of the permit or the person to whom the permit was issued, if he appears, and if the Town Board finds that the mobile home is not being maintained in a clean and sanitary condition, or if it finds that any provision of this ordinance has been violated, or if it finds there is other sufficient cause, may revoke the permit and the mobile home shall be removed from the premises.

SECTION XVI - APPLICATION TO EXISTING MOBILE HOMES NOT LOCATED IN MOBILE HOME PARKS.

The provisions of Section 12 and 14 of this ordinance shall not be applicable to any mobile home parked or placed outside a duly licensed mobile home park on or before the effective date of this ordinance.

Any mobile home parked or placed outside a licensed mobile home park on or before the effective date of this ordinance which shall be moved to any new lot or premises within the town subsequent to said effective date shall immediately become subject to Section 12 and 14 of this ordinance.

SECTION XVII - EXCEPTIONS

(a) None of the provisions of this ordinance shall be applicable to the business of Mobile Home Sales.

(b) None of the provisions of this ordinance shall be applicable to the storage or garaging of Mobile Homes not being used for living or sleeping purposes within a building or structure or to the storage of one unoccupied mobile home on the premises of the owner of such mobile home, provided however, that such unoccupied mobile home shall not be parked between the street line and the front building line of such premises.

(c) None of the provisions of this ordinance shall be applicable to a mobile home located on the site of a construction project, survey project or other similar work project and used solely as a field office or work or tool house in connection with such project, provided such mobile home is removed from said site within a reasonable time after the completion of such project.

(d) The provisions of this ordinance shall not be applicable within the incorporated Village of Palmyra.

SECTION XVIII - PENALTIES

Any person who violates any provision of this ordinance shall be guilty of an offense against such ordinance punishable by a fine of not more than \$100.00 or not more than 30 days imprisonment, or both, and such offense, for the purpose of conferring jurisdiction upon courts and judicial officers, generally, shall be deemed a misdemeanor and for such purposes only all provisions of law relating to misdemeanors shall apply to such violation. In addition, the violation of the ordinance or any of the provisions thereof shall subject the person, firm or corporation violating the same to a civil penalty in the sum of \$50.00, and when a violation of this ordinance or any of the provisions thereof is continuous each week's continued violation shall constitute a separate and distinct violation; said penalty to be recovered by the Town of Palmyra in a civil action. The application of the above penalty or penalties or the prosecution for the violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed to prevent the revocation of any permit issued pursuant thereto or the enforced removal of conditions prohibited by this ordinance.

SECTION XIX - ISSUANCE OF PERMIT NOT TO WAIVE COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER STATUTES OR ORDINANCES.

This issuance of Mobile Home permits pursuant to the provisions of this ordinance shall not be deemed to waive compliance by the holder thereof, by the property owner, or by any occupant of said mobile home park or mobile home with any statute of the State of New York or ordinance or health regulation of the Town of Palmyra.

SECTION XX - VALIDITY

If any section, paragraph, subdivision or provision of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or held unconstitutional the same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any part or provision thereof other than the part so decided to be invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION XXI - EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance shall take effect ten days after posting and publication

thereof and immediately as against any person personally served with a certified copy thereof in accordance with the Town Law of the State of New York:

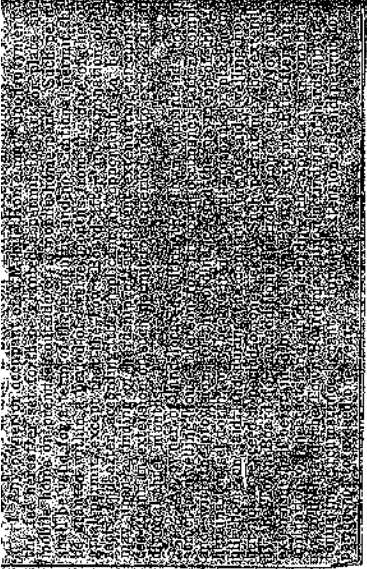
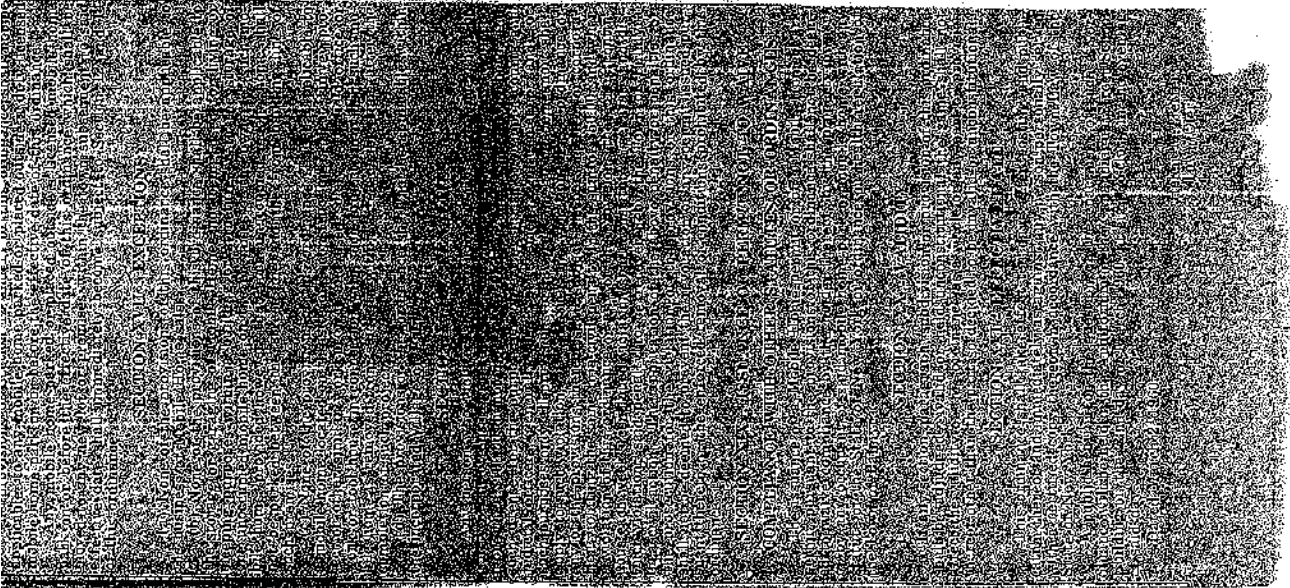

WHEREAS, heretofore and on or about the second day of May 1960, a petition in due form and containing the required signatures was presented to and filed with the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra, Wayne County, New York, for the establishment of an extension to the Canandaigua Road Water District to be known as the Bear Hill Extension to the Canandaigua Road Water District, and

WHEREAS, the property to be included within such extension of such district was more particularly bounded and described in the said petition, and the proposed pipe line was indicated on a map showing the course and extent thereof, and

WHEREAS, the said petition provided that all of the expenses in the construction of the water works should be contributed by the signers thereof and that no part of such expense should be a district or town charge,

NOW THEREFORE THIS AGREEMENT made and executed and between the Town of Palmyra, party of the first part, George L. Burke, party of the second part, Richard W. Watson and Carol W. Watson, parties of the third part and Gene W. Fisher, party of the fourth part.

1. According to the Engineer's estimate, the cost of construction will be as follows:

This does not include the installation of the copper services to the various lots for which the parties of the second part, third part and fourth part are not responsible.

2. Of this sum, the parties of the third part will contribute \$500.00 and the party of the fourth part will contribute \$500.00 the balance of the expenses shall be borne by the party of the second part.

3. The said sum of \$5760.00 shall be deposited in the Genesee Valley Union Trust Company, in a checking account entitled Town of Palmyra Bear Hill Extension, and shall be subject to the check of the Supervisor and Town Clerk of the said town.

4. When the deposit of the said funds has been made a public meeting shall be called by the Town Board of said Town to consider said petition, to hear all persons interested in the subject thereof concerning the same and for such other action on the part of the Town Board with relation to the said premises as may be required by law and are proper in the premises.

5. Provided the extension is approved by the Town Board after such hearing, the Town Board will apply to the Water Resources Commission for permission to construct such addition. Provided such permission is granted the Town Board will take the necessary steps for the installation of the pipe line and will pay the necessary expenses from the funds deposited in the Genesee Valley Union Trust Company as aforesaid.

6. The construction of such addition to the pipe line is contingent upon the approval of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra, and such construction shall be under the direction and control and in accordance with the requirements of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra.

7. The party of the second part agrees that in case the moneys advanced are insufficient to pay the expenses in full, he will make up the deficiency. in case there is an overplus, same shall be returned

to the party of the second part.

8. Neither the parties of the third part nor the party of the fourth part will be required to make any additional payment, nor will they be entitled to receive any part of any overplus, provided there is such overplus.

9. When such pipeline has been completed, the party of the second part, the parties of the third part and the party of the fourth part will give a Bill of Sale of said pipeline, the hydrants, the gate valves, taps, curb stops, boxes and all other personal property used in connection therewith to the Canandaigua Road Water District and the extension thereof.

10. In case the project is not approved and the same cannot be undertaken, the Town shall refund the amounts advanced by the party of the second part, the parties of the third part and the party of the fourth part.

Mr. Baran moved the adoption of the following/Vacation and Sick Leave Plan:

The Town Board of the Town of Palmyra, Wayne County, New York, hereby establishes the following rules and regulations to govern vacations and sick leave of the highway employees of said town.

Section 1: Purpose

The purpose of this resolution is to establish uniform provisions for vacations and sick leaves applicable to employees of the Highway Department of the Town of Palmyra.

Section 2: Definitions

The term "Employees of the Highway Department" shall include all employees of that Department except the Superintendent and temporary, hourly or per diem employees.

The term "Working Day" shall mean each week day except Saturday, Sunday or a legal holiday unless otherwise directed or authorized by the Town Board.

Section 3: Vacations

All highway employees in service on January 1, 1960, shall be entitled to annual vacations with pay based upon their years of service and employment, as follows:

- a. One to five years continuous service - one week's vacation.
- b. Five to twenty-five years continuous service - two week's vacation.
- c. Twenty-five years and over continuous service - three weeks vacation.
- d. The term "week" as applied to a vacation period shall mean a calendar week of seven days, Sunday through Saturday. But in no one week's vacation period shall there be vacation for more than five working days, nor in the two week's vacation period more than ten working days, and in the three week's period no more than fifteen working days vacation.

All public holidays set forth in Section 21 of the General Construction Law of McKinney's Consolidated Laws shall be granted to employees. An additional day's vacation shall be granted to each employee for each holiday falling within a vacation period.

One month's notice of a vacation period desired shall be given by each employee to the Highway Superintendent and all vacations shall be taken at a time fixed by the Highway Superintendent. No employee, however, shall be entitled to a vacation upon the severing of his connection or employment status with the Town, even though he would otherwise be entitled to such vacation.

All vacations shall be taken in the calendar year during which the employee becomes entitled thereto, and no part of such vacation shall be carried over from one year to another.

Section 4:

All previous resolutions or policies adopted by the Town Board pertaining to vacations of employees and now in force, are hereby rescinded and repealed.

Section 5: Sick Leaves

Absence from duty by an employee of the Highway Department by reason of his sickness or disability not covered by the Workmen's Compensation Law, shall be allowed as provided in this section and not otherwise. Absence from duty for such reasons, if duly granted by the Highway Superintendent shall be considered and known as "sick leave". The following regulations shall govern such absence from duty:

- a. An employee may be absent from duty on account of sickness or disability. Every leave for such absence is granted by the Highway Superintendent.
- b. No employee shall receive any part of his compensation while absent from duty because of sickness or disability except as herein provided.
- c. An employee shall be granted sick leave with a pay of one (1) working day a month or twelve (12) working days a year. Such sick leave with pay shall be granted to the employee by the Highway Superintendent.
- d. The twelve (12) working days a year to be allowed an employee for sick leave with pay may hereafter be accumulated at the rate of one (1) day a month until a total of one hundred and twenty (120) days is reached and may be kept to his credit for future sick leave with pay.
- e. Upon becoming sick or disabled, an employee may, during his sickness or disability, be granted sick leave with pay to the extent of the unused sick leave time which he has accumulated, but no sick leave with pay shall be granted to any such person in excess of one hundred twenty (120) days in any one calendar year. Sick leave time shall be retroactive only to January 1, 1956.
- f. Allowed sick leave time shall be considered for all purposes as continuous service, but, in the event of resignation or discharge of an employee, his accumulated and unused sick leave time shall be cancelled and not paid for.
- g. An employee isolated or quarantined because of exposure to a communicable disease, other than in the line of duty, shall for the purpose of this regulation be considered absent because of sickness and may be granted sick leave with pay during such isolation or quarantine to the extent of his accumulated and unused sick leave time.
- h. Where an employee receives compensation under the Workmen's Compensation Law on account of disability, he shall be entitled to receive from the Town the difference only between such Compensation and his rate of pay.
- i. The Highway Superintendent may require a physician's certificate for any absence of more than one (1) day. But in all cases a physician's certificate shall be required for each fourteen (14) days of continuous absence. In any case, the Highway Superintendent may require an examination by a physician of his choice, or other accessible evidence that the illness is bona fide.

j. In addition to sick leave, on the death of a child or wife, sister or brother, father or mother any employee shall be entitled to a leave of absence for the period commencing with the date of death through the day of the deceased relative's funeral.

k. All previous resolutions and policies pertaining to sick leave for employees, adopted and in force, are hereby rescinded and repealed.

Section 6:

This regulation shall take effect immediately.

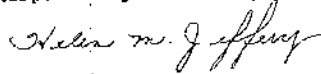
