He advised that there are 4 ways this could be done. (1) Form separate districts, (2) Form a Town-Wide District, (3) Put charge against Part Town Fund, (4) Put charge on Town Wide as is now done. Following considerable discussion on the part of the Board members, as well as remarks by interested persons, Mrs. Cowell and Mrs. Dahmske, the Board decided to put this into committee, for Study.

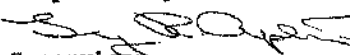

Palmyra Town Historian Report 1974

The year started out quite well. Mrs. Thomas O'Connell asked me what we could do to help preserve Palmyra's history. I suggested that we interview the older people of the town and record what they said. The first couple were Mr. & Mrs. ~~Quinn~~ ~~Quinn~~. It went so well that we quickly contacted Mrs. Madge Chapman and Mrs. Hester Lawler. We did collect quite a bit of interesting little stories of the happenings in the village, events, and changes in the business section. Then, when Mrs. O'Conner became busy with other activities, we stopped the interviews, but hope to start again this year. These will be kept by Historic Palmyra as they paid for the tapes but can be borrowed by other organizations.

I tried several ideas to be printed in the weekly paper, but it would be in for several weeks. Then they wouldn't have room, and it would be skipped for a time. I felt I could use the time which I spent researching ~~the~~ for the material to a better advantage.

Inquiries from people looking for information on their ancestors seem to be on an increase every year. It is so satisfying when you can find something for them. I hope in the coming year to collect lists of the various cemeteries in the township so that I can be of greater assistance to them.

I believe that one way I can be of help as Town Historian is giving time to Historic Palmyra and the Wayne County Historical Society. I helped with the publicity for the Farmer's Market held in the Village Park. This proved a most successful venture as it brought the village and town residents together. Everyone seemed to enjoy themselves. On county level I have helped on the program committee.

For Canal Days I arranged a window in the McPike Store. Selling appliances, I used the theme of the laundry. With a dress form dressed in a cotton dress of the 1860 period with a bonnet for a head, I had the lady leaning over a wash tub scrubbing clothes. As a background I used a clothes line with underwear of that period hanging from it. In front I had an exhibit of different types of irons.

Also for Historic Palmyra I started to research for houses which were built at least 100 years ago. They had to be well kept and of good architecture. As a beginning we contacted eighteen house owners who were willing to pay for the plaques on which the date of the building of the house is inscribed. This coming year the plan is to encourage more people to purchase these plaques throughout the Township so that residents in this area and those visiting will have a greater appreciation of this area.

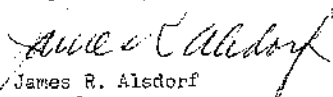

Gentlemen,

The undersigned, as duly authorized members of a Committee of Concerned Citizens, sincerely request that the Members of the Town Board of Palmyra, take into serious consideration the effects of any actions taken by the Jamson Corporation in their application for a special permit to establish a mining operation in the Town of Palmyra.

We represent many residents of Palmyra, and the residents of Palmyra Election District #5 in particular, are violently opposed to the use or permitting of a use of a mining operation, for the following reasons:

1. The Jamson Corporation plan does not take into consideration, nor show any study was taken, where the general welfare of the residents of the area would be affected by their mining operation.
2. The only plan submitted by Jamson Corporation to date, has been an old aerial map outlining in blue and red pencil the area involved, and not taking into consideration but actually hiding many grievous faults.
3. Nowhere in the Jamson plan is provision made for a particular depth to reach in their excavations.
4. Nowhere in their plan is there any provision made for fencing off or even restricting access to an open pit or nuisance area whereby young children may wander and suffer subsequent harm or danger.
5. Nowhere does the plan show they intend to abide by any existing zoning laws once they have a blanket permit.
6. Nowhere has Jamson even offered to comply with any existing highway regulations regarding the use of heavy trucks and other related equipment while using light duty Town roads.
7. Nowhere does the Jamson plan offer to submit to a Department of Environmental Conservation study to make sure their land use does not affect the ecology and water table of the present and future residents of the entire area.

We therefore ask the Members of the Palmyra Town Board to consider the feelings of the people who have long been residents of this beautiful and peaceful countryside.

We are, none of us, against progress - but progress in the form of the dangerous open pits, waterholes, steep slopes, stone crushers, cement mixers, noise, dust, haze, and the constant rumble of heavy trucks creating traffic hazards, and breaking up our good roads does

not constitute progress nor desirable industry.

To take prime agricultural land and convert it into another Oaks Corners is a disaster, not only to the nearby residents, but to all the people of the Town of Palmyra.

Further development of the new housing rapidly building up in the vicinity with its resulting increased taxable valuation, which would ease the burden of all Palmyra residents, would be severely restricted by possible devaluation of these properties when confronted with noisome and hazardous conditions that would result from a landscared eyesore.

We question whether it is good policy and long range judgement whereby anyone can move in and tear up good land simply because they have acquired it, without any intention or plan of ever restoring or reclaiming it, without any concern or consideration of the health, welfare, and well-being of so many citizens of our Town.

We ask that the Town Board make provisions that these same citizens should not be made to suffer in the face of a so called industry, where the only return for our depleted wells, broken roads, lower property values, unsanitary and very unwelcome conditions is a dubious return of a few paltry tax dollars.

The sale of gravel, no matter how piously justified, whereby a few members of a corporation stand to profit largely, while the great majority of the community ends up as losers most assuredly makes us all wonder just where our actual and esthetic values really lie.

We ask that the Town Board read this letter at their meeting April 10th and that it be incorporated in the minutes of this meeting.

Dear Supervisor Aplin and Members of the Palmyra Town Board:

This letter is in response to a request made on the evening of May 8 relative to the application of Jamson Corporation for a special permit pursuant to Article 7 Sections 7.9 and 7.1 of the Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Palmyra to draw gravel from premises on Palmer Road.

The standard for your decision in this matter is the protection of the health, safety and general welfare of the public. The reasons for your decision must be found to be based upon facts in the record before you. Some concern has been voiced that regardless of what decision is made a court challenge may be inevitable; either by the aggrieved developer or by the aggrieved citizen. Therefore, I would make the following recommendations relative to the qualify of the material before you.

1. Highways: You should have before you the opinion of either the town engineer, the highway superintendent, the county highway superintendent or some other knowledgeable source of the effect upon the condition of the roads proposed to be used in connection with this gravel draw. The information may suggest some weight limits are appropriate with relief to the developer by way of bonding.

2. Water: The question of water qualify and water table have arisen but I find nothing but suggestions of future studies in the record. It appears that because of a law effective April 1, 1975 an application to the Office of Environmental Conservation is required by the developer. If the standards are promulgated by the Office of Environmental Conservation and such a submission has been made pursuant thereto then a copy of that submission should be part of your

record, the findings, conclusions and determinations of the Office of Environmental Conservation should be reviewed and either adopted or rejected with specific cause. If the Office of Environmental Conservation standards have not been promulgated then the town engineer should be requested to review the matter and should indicate the submissions required by the developer of documentary information. The town engineer should then advise the Board of the potential effect of the proposed use on the water source. The Planning Board minutes of its meeting of January 14, 1975 indicate that George Lawrence stated that surveys and geological materials were being prepared at that time. Specifically that material should be part of the submission to your town engineer on this question.

3. Fencing: The question of visual pollution and safety has been raised and nothing in the record indicates what the developer would do to secure the area both from the view of safety or with an eye toward protecting the area against the gradual development of visual blight.

4. Hardship: Some submission of even a hand drawn map indicating the proximity of gravel pits in the area both owned by this developer and by anyone else should be in your record.

5. Map: A map of the subject area should be attached to the description contained in the March Planning Board recommendation. Even a copy of the town tax map initialed by the developer would suffice. This is especially necessary to more precisely set the point of beginning in the legal description.

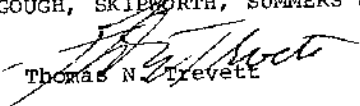
I would also suggest that an appropriate condition would be to void special permit if use discontinued for six months.

Once having acquired the above your decision will be based upon facts obtained from your record and will therefore be difficult to overturn.

REVISED RECOMMENDATIONS FROM PLANNING BOARD
PRESENTED BY BRUCE WIDEMAN 3/13/75

The Town Planning Board recommends that the Jamson Corporation be allowed to haul gravel from the so-called Marsille Pit located Northwest of Eckert Road and Palmer Road.

The area is further described as follows: Commencing at a point 500' west of the S.W. corner of the Marsille Property thence 800' in a Westerly direction, thence in a Northerly direction a distance of approximately 800', thence East a distance of approximately 800', thence South a distance of approximately 800' to the point of beginning.

The area described above is basically the area presently stripped of overburden.

The following conditions apply:

- (1.) No crusher operation permitted.
- (2.) No hauling of trucks or movement of heavy equipment before 7:00 A.M. and after 7:00 P.M..
- (3.) No excavation shall be permitted below water table.
- (4.) Upon completion of permit, Plans and any and all information submitted to New York State in order to comply with the New York State Mined Land Reclamation Law of 2/19/74, a copy of all plans etc. shall be filed with the Town Clerk.
- (5.) The Town Board grant conditional approval for the area or parcel of land above stated, for a period of one year commencing 3/13/75.
- (6.) The present depth of cut or floor of pit shall be maintained.

6. Only refuse having its origination from residences and businesses located within the Village or Town of Palmyra shall be permitted. Each commercial hauler shall file with the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra an affidavit acknowledged as in a form for recording an instrument which shall:

A. State name and address of each owner and/or stockholder of the applicant and the name under which the business is conducted.

B. The affidavit shall affirmatively state that the applicant knows the Town boundary lines and has reviewed a Town map which will be attached to the affidavit and state that all customers whose refuse he is currently disposing in the Town of Palmyra landfill are residents of the Town of Palmyra, and that the applicant will not in the future haul refuse etc. to the Town of Palmyra landfill which refuse he knows is generated outside the confines of the Town of Palmyra and the Village of Palmyra nor will he pick up refuse for depositing in Town of Palmyra landfill outside the confines of the Town of Palmyra and the Village of Palmyra.

C. That the hauler will permit on reasonable notice (2 hours) visual inspection by Town authorities in his presence of his customer list which he shall certify contains a list of all the customers which he services and also whose refuse is being hauled to the Town of Palmyra landfill. If there is found to be a violation on the list, then the Town authorities shall have the right to an immediate copy of said list.

D. That he understands that his right as a commercial hauler may be terminated in the event of any violation of any of the rules of the landfill and any violation or untruth of any statement made

in this affidavit.

E. This affidavit shall be presented annually to the Town Board and also as often or as frequently as there is a change in the ownership of the business or stock controlling the business.

In regard to the Town's Landfill situation, Supervisor Aplin has talked with Mr. Clark and Mr. Bush at the Avon Office of the Department of Environmental Conservation. They seem to be more concerned at this point about the Brush Landfill Site. The Supervisor contacted Lloyd Greene, Village Trustee, about the Town using the Village Chipper in order to get the Brush Landfill in better condition. There are a few problems with garbage being put on the Brush site.

Hunting and Fishing Day

Because of the outstanding contributions that America's hunters and fishermen have made to conservation, recreation and the economy, they are deserving of special recognition.

Since the turn of the century, hunters and anglers have been the leaders in nearly all major conservation programs. These sportsmen-conservationists are responsible for the founding of state fish and game departments in all 50 states. They asked that they, themselves, be required to buy licenses and that the money collected be used to support state conservation agencies. In the last 50 years alone, these sportsmen have provided \$2.5 Billion for conservation programs.

Hunters and fishermen asked for the establishment of regulated seasons and bag limits so that sportsmen could harvest the annual crop of game and fish without damage to the basic breeding population. The result has been that there are now more deer, elk, antelope and wild turkey in the United States than there were 50 years ago. Further, sportsmen's programs have benefited numerous species of non-game fish and wildlife through habitat development.

Hunters and fishermen, unique in all America, asked that their fishing and hunting equipment be taxed and that the money be used for land acquisition, research and habitat management for fish and wildlife for the enjoyment of all Americans.

Through their publications and organizations--such as the National Wildlife Federation, Ducks Unlimited, Izaak Walton League of America and many others--hunters and fishermen have led the nation in the battle for a better environment and the wise use of our natural resources.

Therefore, I Leroy R. Aplin, Supervisor ~~XXXXXX~~ of the ~~XXXXXX~~ Town of Palmyra, do hereby proclaim Saturday, September 27, 1975, as Palmyra Hunting and Fishing Day and that this day be an annual observance the fourth Saturday of each September. I urge all of our citizens to join with sportsmen-conservationists in a rededication to the wise use of our natural resources and their proper management for the benefit of future generations. Further, I urge all citizens to take part in Hunting and Fishing Day activities on September 27 to learn more about conservation and outdoor skills.
