



What is a comprehensive plan?

Comprehensive planning is a community planning process that creates a framework and a guide that shapes a community's physical, social, and economic development aspirations. Intended to be led by and created for the community, a comprehensive plan articulates a vision for the future, planning principles, priority policy areas, and action items to direct day-to-day and long-term decision-making for local leaders and the community of Palmyra.

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Benefits of a Comprehensive Plan

Social

- Builds community cohesion by providing opportunities for the public to become engaged in shaping the future vision for the Village and Town, developing priority policy areas, and curating an implementation strategy.

Physical

- Outlines future land use recommendations for the community
- Allows for a proactive approach to making development decisions
- Incorporates smart growth and sustainability community planning principles to support resiliency

Economic

- Overviews existing demographic and economic conditions in the community
- Determines priority policy areas for the Village & Town to drive revitalization and economic resilience

Political

- Creates a foundational planning document to guide local leaders in their decision-making
- Outlines community priorities to help decision-makers allocate funding and resources for the betterment of Palmyra





NY Forward Public Engagement (Part 1)

What is NY Forward?

Every year since 2016, the Downtown Revitalization Initiative (DRI) matching grant program has provided \$10 million in funding to 10 municipalities across the state to revitalize their downtowns.

New York Forward is a smaller version of this program for towns and villages, with 3 municipalities from each of NY's 10 regions receiving between \$2.25 and \$4.5 million.

How does it work?

Communities work together to identify public and private “transformative projects,” which tell a cohesive narrative of the downtown’s revitalization.

For example, a public sidewalk project connects a new public park to a renovated private restaurant, which is across the street from a renovated private historic church.

The Village applied for a NY Forward grant in 2023 but was unfortunately unsuccessful. **We seek your input to help us make our next application even stronger for this year!**


Your feedback will help us identify which **public projects** to pursue, why they’re important, and how they connect to each other.

Potential NY Forward Projects



Comprehensive renovation/restoration of historic Village Hall, adding central air, improved back doors, restoring second floor



Renovation of park with additions of playground equipment, benches, and tables; creation of trail at park linking canal trail

Municipal Parking Lot Improvements



Excavation/repaving of municipal parking lot, including trees to deter curb-cutters and addition of EV charging stations

Business Assistance Fund

A 50% matching grant program to be distributed to local businesses for smaller interior and aesthetic improvements
